## Football on the Turks & Caicos Islands

## The first Goal Project

On 27 October 2002, FIFA Vice-President Jack Warner opened the new national training centre in Providenciales. *Goal* and FIFA's Financial Assistance Programme bore the costs of this centre, which boasts a pitch with floodlight installations, dressing rooms and a surrounding fence. Private patrons provided the national association with the necessary land and the centre is now at the hub of football life on the islands. It is primarily used by the football-crazy youngsters, who now have the opportunity to further develop their burgeoning talents. Thanks to the new complex, an array of projects aimed at promoting youth, school and women's football have also been launched. «For small countries such as the Turks & Caicos Islands, the *Goal* Programme and FIFA's Financial Assistance Programme are extremely important,» stressed Thomas H. Smith, the president of the Turks & Caicos Islands FA, in his opening address.

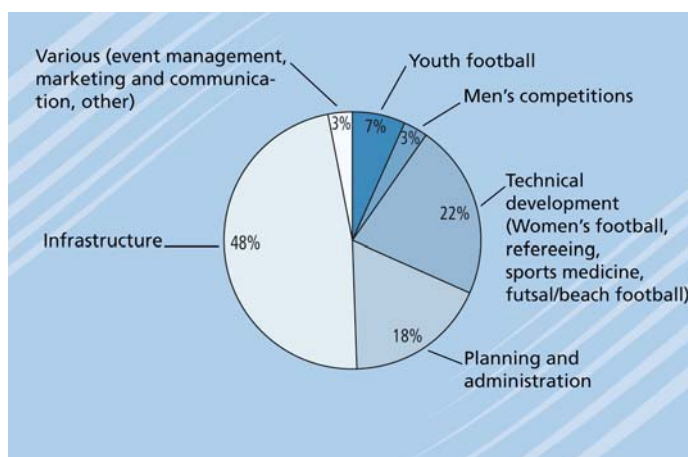

## Second Goal project

The objective of the second project in the Turks and Caicos Islands was to complete its "house of football" by integrating association headquarters into the national training centre that was built in the country's first Goal project. The Goal Bureau backed this plan at its meeting on 15 March 2006 as well as a proposal to construct a secure fence enclosing the entire complex. The association believes that the completed facilities will make it possible to promote the game more actively, particularly at youth level, through courses and training camps. In addition to funding from Goal, the project is being part-financed by the FIFA Financial Assistance Programme and funds from the association's own coffers.
